

Annual Report Overview

In the past five years, there has been an average of 89 Part 1 offenses and 47 Part 2 offenses per year. In the 2014 calendar year, there were 86 Part 1 offenses, compared to 82 in 2013. There were 35 Part 2 offenses in 2014, compared to 52 offenses in 2013.

“Other offenses” (including DWI, drug, and non-traffic related offenses) decreased 23%. In 2013 there were 352 “other offenses”; in 2014 there were 270 “other offenses”.

Calls for service decreased by 13% in 2014; with 16,055 calls in 2013, and 14,049 calls in 2014.

A total of 1531 reports were written in 2014; which includes 772 original reports and 759 supplemental reports.

The Criminal Investigation Division’s case clearance rate was 64% in 2014.

The total number of arrests, including both custodial and non-custodial, decreased 22% in 2014. There were 361 total arrests in 2014; including 51 non-custodial arrests and 3 juvenile arrests.

Officers conducted 3907 traffic stops in 2014; a decrease of 34% from 2013. These stops resulted in a total of 3952 traffic summonses.

The total number of traffic accidents reported increased 1% in 2014. There were 284 reported in 2013 and 288 reported in 2014.

Shrewsbury Police Department employees received a total of 1509 hours of training in 2014.

There were a total of 26 CIT (Crisis Intervention Team) reports written in 2014, as opposed to 21 written in 2013; a increase of 24%.

There were three Internal Affairs Investigations in 2014.

There were two Part 1 crimes and one Part 2 crime reported in the Village of Mackenzie in 2013.

The Shrewsbury Police Department completed 15 Income Tax Return Fraud Reports. Although the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has jurisdiction over these types of investigations, local police agencies complete written reports to document the information. These reports are completed as a courtesy to residents so they are able to submit paperwork to the IRS; however, they are not included in the department’s crime statistics, as it cannot be determined where such crimes occurred.

The Shrewsbury Police Department was inspected by assessors of the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA) in November and once again received Advanced Accreditation.








Reported Crimes









Accidents by Day of Week




Accidents by Time of Day




The Shrewsbury Police Department wrote 151 vehicle accident reports in 2014. Of the 151 reports written, 27% were on State Arterial Roadways and 40% were on County Arterial Roadways. Of the remaining reports, 17% were on Private Property and 16% were on City Roadways.

Over the past 5 years the average number of accident reports written per year is 160. In 2014, there were 6% fewer accidents written than that average.



All Shrewsbury officers qualified with their duty weapons twice during 2014. The firearms training/qualification included duty weapons, off duty weapons, department shotguns and patrol rifles.

Officers were trained in Multi-Assault Counter Terrorism Action Capability (MACTAC) during which they were trained to respond and react to active shooter incidents. They also received training Civil Disturbance Response Techniques to improve skills and tactics in riot and civil unrest incidents.

All officers received the following in-service roll call policy training refreshers: Internal Affairs; Disciplinary System; Grievance Procedures; Harassment & Discrimination in the Workplace; Employee-Involved Domestic Violence; Department Authorized Weapons; Strip & Body Cavity Searches; Social Media; Officer Deployment & Emergency Vehicle Operations; CALEA Accreditation Management.

Crisis Intervention Team

The Shrewsbury Police Department currently has sixteen police officers trained and certified as Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) members. The Crisis Intervention Team members receive in depth training on how to recognize and deal with those suffering from mental illness. The goal of the Crisis Intervention Team is to properly deal with and assist those who are mentally ill. The program is administered by the St. Louis County Police Department and the St. Louis County Circuit Courts has organized a Mental Health Division as a jail diversion program. The Mental Health Court was designed to assist offenders who have been officially diagnosed with a mental illness and have been charged with a crime as a result of their condition. The goal of the St. Louis County Mental Health Court is to provide offenders with resources to assist them effectively deal with their mental illness so they can live productive lives. The Shrewsbury Police Department joined the Crisis Intervention Team in 2005 and joined the St. Louis County Mental Health Court in 2006. The goal of the Shrewsbury Police Department is to get 100% of the patrol officers trained as CIT members and remain dedicated to the Crisis Intervention Team's efforts. Sixteen of seventeen commissioned officers are CIT trained.

In 2014 the Shrewsbury Police Department conducted three Internal Affairs investigations. One complaint was received internally; two were received externally.

CALEA Accreditation

The Shrewsbury Police Department is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA). The purpose of the CALEA Accreditation Program is to improve the delivery of public safety services, primarily by maintaining a body of standards developed by public safety practitioners. These standards are designed to strengthen crime prevention and control capabilities; formalize essential management procedures; establish fair and nondiscriminatory personnel practices; improve service-delivery; solidify interagency cooperation and coordination; and boost citizen and staff confidence in the agency.

The Shrewsbury Police Department first obtained CALEA Recognition status in 2006. Since that time, the Department has moved to Advanced Accreditation and has since had on-site inspections every three years to maintain our accreditation. In November, 2014, assessors once again assessed and inspected our agency to ensure that we are in compliance with the required standards and that our practices and procedures are in line with their internationally recognized and accepted standards. Once again, the Shrewsbury Police Department earned the Advanced Accreditation Award.
