

Annual Report Overview

In the past five years, there has been an average of 92 Part 1 offenses and 46 Part 2 offenses per year. In the 2015 calendar year, there were 131 Part 1 offenses, compared to 86 in 2014. There were 52 Part 2 offenses in 2015, compared to 35 offenses in 2014.

“Other offenses” (including DWI, drug, and non-traffic related offenses) decreased 55%. In 2014 there were 270 “other offenses”; in 2015 there were 121 “other offenses”.

Calls for service decreased by 10% in 2015; with 12744 calls in 2015, and 14,049 calls in 2014.

A total 1,707 reports were written in 2015; which includes 809 original reports and 898 supplement reports. This is an increase of 11% from the number of reports written in 2014 (1531).

The Criminal Investigation Division’s case clearance rate was 73% in 2015.

Officers affected a total of 308 arrests in 2015, including 277 custodial, 28 non-custodial, and 3 juvenile arrests.

Officers conducted 2647 traffic stops in 2015, resulting in 2312 traffic citations.

The total number of traffic accidents reported increased 17% in 2015. There were 336 reported in 2015 and 288 reported in 2014.

Shrewsbury Police Department employees received a total of 1910 hours of training in 2015.

There were a total of 16 CIT (Crisis Intervention Team) reports written in 2015, as opposed to 26 written in 2014; a decrease of 38%.

There were two Internal Affairs Investigations in 2015.

There were two Part 1 crimes and no Part 2 crime reported in the Village of Mackenzie in 2013.

The Shrewsbury Police Department completed 16 Income Tax Return Fraud Reports. Although the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) has jurisdiction over these types of investigations, local police agencies complete written reports to document the information. These reports are completed as a courtesy to residents so they are able to submit paperwork to the IRS; however, they are not included in the department’s crime statistics, as it cannot be determined where such crimes occurred.


Calls for Service

Reported Crimes











Accidents by Day of Week




Accidents by Time of Day




The Shrewsbury Police Department wrote 219 vehicle accident reports in 2015. Of the 219 reports written: 43% occurred on State Arterial Roadways, 37% occurred on County Arterial Roadways, 10% occurred on Private Property, and 10% were on City Roadways.

Over the past 5 years the average number of accident reports written per year is 172. In 2015, there were 27% more accidents written than that average.



All Shrewsbury officers qualified with their duty weapons twice during 2015. The firearms training/qualification included duty weapons, off duty weapons, department shotguns and patrol rifles.

Officers were trained in Multi-Assault Counter Terrorism Action Capability (MACTAC) during which they were trained to respond and react to active shooter incidents. They also received training Civil Disturbance Response Techniques to improve skills and tactics in riot and civil unrest incidents.

All officers received the following in-service roll call policy training refreshers: All Hazards Plan, Unusual Occurrences, Department Philosophy, Drug and Alcohol Policy, Standards of Conduct, Harassment and Discrimination in the Workplace, Prisoner Transportation, Prisoner Booking and Detention, Vehicular Pursuits, and Use of Force.

Crisis Intervention Team

The Shrewsbury Police Department currently has sixteen police officers trained and certified as Crisis Intervention Team (CIT) members. The Crisis Intervention Team members receive in depth training on how to recognize and deal with those suffering from mental illness. The goal of the Crisis Intervention Team is to properly deal with and assist those who are mentally ill. The program is administered by the St. Louis County Police Department and the St. Louis County Circuit Courts has organized a Mental Health Division as a jail diversion program. The Mental Health Court was designed to assist offenders who have been officially diagnosed with a mental illness and have been charged with a crime as a result of their condition. The goal of the St. Louis County Mental Health Court is to provide offenders with resources to assist them effectively deal with their mental illness so they can live productive lives. The Shrewsbury Police Department joined the Crisis Intervention Team in 2005 and joined the St. Louis County Mental Health Court in 2006. We remain dedicated to the Crisis Intervention Team's efforts.

In 2015 the Shrewsbury Police Department conducted two Internal Affairs investigations. Both were received externally. One of the complaints was unfounded, the other was sustained. Appropriate corrective action and training was provided in the second instance. These investigations were based on isolated incidents, and no identifiable trends, patterns, or needs were discovered that would require a change in department policy or procedure.

CALEA Accreditation

The Shrewsbury Police Department is accredited by the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies (CALEA). The purpose of the CALEA Accreditation Program is to improve the delivery of public safety services, primarily by maintaining a body of standards developed by public safety practitioners. These standards are designed to strengthen crime prevention and control capabilities; formalize essential management procedures; establish fair and nondiscriminatory personnel practices; improve service-delivery; solidify interagency cooperation and coordination; and boost citizen and staff confidence in the agency.

The Shrewsbury Police Department first obtained CALEA Recognition status in 2006. Since that time, the Department has moved to Advanced Accreditation and has since had on-site inspections every three years to maintain our accreditation. The Police Department was last assessed and inspected in November, 2014, to ensure that we are in compliance with the required standards and that our practices and procedures are in line with CALEA's internationally recognized and accepted standards. The Shrewsbury Police Department earned the Advanced Accreditation Award.
