Roll Call

Mayor Buckley opened the meeting and City Clerk Llorián commenced with the roll call. The entire board was present.

Approval of Minutes

Mayor Buckley introduced the minutes for the September 27, 2016 work session and opened the floor for discussion. There being no discussion, Alderwoman Gorman made a motion to approve the minutes. Alderman Travaglini seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Bills

Mayor Buckley introduced the bills submitted for payment, quickly reviewed each, and asked if there was any discussion. There being no discussion, Alderman Scherer made a motion to approve the bills submitted for payment. Alderwoman Gorman seconded the motion and they were unanimously approved.

Department Head Reports

Director of Administration Greever went over the blue print plans project with the Board. He informed the Board that part-time building clerk, Zandra William, resigned. He stated that the new Aldi's had a grand opening on Monday at the Center at Kenrick and that all went well. He added that the next phase of the project will be the Route 66 viewing platform. He added that ECDC have posted a search for a new director position. He stated that he will be attending the Missouri Economic Development Financing Associate conference. He concluded he had his fourth meeting of the comprehensive committee.

Fire Chief Amenn stated that they received a clean bill of health on the water damage to fire department. He stated the repair project should be completed by the end of October. He stated that the second annual Chief Bill Fox Hole-In-One was a great success. He stated the event raised over \$3200 for life safety education and smoke detectors.

Superintendent Wagner stated the CDBG project started yesterday. He stated that they are oiling salt spreaders. He added the hayride at the fall festive went well. He added curb work will be starting on St. Charles and St. Michaels shortly. He concluded he is hoping to return back to work after his surgery on November 4th after he completes physical therapy and gets a medical release from his doctor.

Park Director Buck thanked everyone that helped with the fall festival. He stated that they received a grant for 18 trees from Missouri Forestry Relief. He stated that October 22nd is Make a Difference Day and that they are looking for volunteer help. He stated that November 17th is the next park board meeting.

Mayor Buckley asked Director Buck if he had received bids for painting of the ballroom. He stated they do not have bids back, that they will be going out on Friday. Mayor asked if there was a certain amount estimated for the project. Director Buck stated estimation would be between \$8000 - \$10,000. Mayor Buckley added that there will be a surplus at the end of 2016. She stated originally this project was budgeted in capital improvement for 2017. She asked the board if they would approve to use the surplus to paint the ballroom in December 2016 when then the ballroom if used less. Alderman Scherer made a motion to use the surplus from 2016 to paint the ballroom. Alderwoman Gorman seconded the motion and they were unanimously approved.

Police Chief Keller expressed his appreciation to Mayor Buckley. He stated that whenever there is a situation that an officer has been hurt in the line of duty in the area he can anticipate a call from Mayor Buckley expressing her concerns for our officers. He stated the youth outreach program will begin next week with 11 people signed up to participate. He concluded that they received a grant for body armor.

Mayor Buckley asked if the police department Facebook page has gone live. Chief Keller stated it has gone live and they are being careful on what they post on the page.

Mayor's Report

Mayor Buckley stated that Finance Director Oettle has been working on the budget and the budget workshop for the next meeting. She stated they have passed the employee manual and there will be some tweaking of somethings along the way. She stated that she met with Ameren UE this morning regarding the Route 66 project. She stated the platform will be completed in November. She stated that the November date may not be the best time for a grand opening depending on the weather. Alderman Travaglini asked if that would be early November or late November. Mayor Buckley stated that she was not sure. She concluded they will wait until the next meeting depending on the weather.



Adjournment


Alderman Travaglini made a motion to adjourn the regular meeting. Alderman Kauffmann seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.
