Roll Call

Mayor Buckley opened the meeting and City Clerk Llorián commenced with the roll call. The entire board was present.

Public Hearing – 2017 CDBG Allocation

Mayor Buckley opened the public hearing. Director Greever added that there were handouts available for the residents to read on the grant. There were no residents who approached the Board, Alderman Travaglini made a motion to close the public hearing. Alderman Scherer seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously. Mayor Buckley closed the hearing.

Approval of Minutes

Mayor Buckley introduced the minutes for the May 10, 2016 regular session and opened the floor for discussion. There being no discussion, Alderman Travaglini made a motion to approve the minutes. Alderman Scherer seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Binder Lift Purchase Request – Fire Department

Fire Chief Amenn presented his purchase request for the purchase of binder lift. He stated that the fire department received a donation from Our Lady of Life Apartments for the amount of \$1200.00 for the purchase of the life from EA Medical LLC. Alderman Kauffmann made a motion to accept Chief Amenn's recommendation. The motion was seconded by Alderman Kopff, and passed unanimously.

Additional Equipment for 2016 Ambulance – Fire Department

Fire Chief Amenn presented his purchase request for the purchase of additional equipment for the new ambulance. He stated that a number of items were overlooked or left off of the budget to fully equip the new ambulance. He added that this request is for an addendum to the capital purchase request to outfit the ambulance as needed. Chief stated that this is an addendum to already approved capital item purchase and that items must be purchased from several different vendors in the amount of \$3102.00, he asked that the Board waive any bid requirements. Alderman Kauffmann made a motion to accept Chief Amenn's recommendation. The motion was seconded by Alderman Scherer, and passed unanimously.

Liquor Licenses

Mayor Buckley presented the liquor license applications for St. Michael's – an annual license for the sale of beer and wine only and three temporary licenses for the sale of beer and wine only for the picnic June 6, 2016, and the soccer tournament August 5 and 12, 2016. A motion to approve all of the St. Michael's liquor licenses was made by Alderman Travaglini. Alderwoman Gorman seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously with Alderman Kopff abstaining from the vote as the person applying for St. Michael's.

Ordinances**(Bill No. 2867)**

Mayor Buckley introduced Bill No. 2867, a bill amending Title II: public health safety and welfare; of the City of Shrewsbury, Missouri code by deleting chapter 201: fire department and replacing it with a new chapter 201: fire department; providing for the current maintenance of this code; providing for the repeal of all conflicting ordinances; and providing for the effective date of this ordinance. Mayor Buckley asked if there was any discussion. There being no discussion, a motion was made by Alderman Travaglini, seconded by Alderman Steingrubby, and it passed with a majority of the board voting in favor of the motion in accordance with Section 79.130 as approved by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, to read the Bill by Title only first time.

(Bill No. 2868)

Mayor Buckley introduced Bill No. 2868, a bill amending Title III: traffic code; of the City of Shrewsbury, Missouri code by deleting schedule X: restricted turns; schedule Xiii: stop signs; and the location section of schedule XIV: fire lanes: and replacing them with a new schedule X: restricted turns: schedule XII: stop signs: and a new location section of schedule XIV: fire lanes; amending section 355.100 of the City of Shrewsbury municipal code; providing for the current maintenance of this code; providing for the repeal of all conflicting ordinances; and providing for the effective date of this ordinance. Mayor Buckley asked if there was any discussion. There being no discussion, a motion was made by Alderman Scherer, seconded by Alderman Travaglini, and it passed with a majority of the board voting in favor of the motion in accordance with Section 79.130 as approved by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, to read the Bill by Title only first time.

(Bill No. 2869)

Mayor Buckley introduced Bill No. 2869, a bill amending article IV, section 100.100 and otherwise revising the Sunshine Law policy for the City of Shrewsbury, Missouri, and repealing all ordinances or parts of ordinance in conflict with the provision of this ordinance. Mayor Buckley asked if there was any discussion. There being no discussion, a motion was made by Alderwoman Gorman, seconded by Alderman Kopff, and it passed with a majority of the board voting in favor of the motion in accordance with Section 79.130 as approved by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, to read the Bill by Title only first time.

Discussion

Mayor Buckley open the discussion of clothing donation drop boxes. She stated that many of these donation boxes fall under dumpsters and that most of the time these boxes are stuffed with items falling out. She stated that many are popping up throughout the City and someone is running a business on another business' property. She added that when full, these donations boxes become a nuisance. She stated that some city's require business licenses be issued for each box, restrict them by zoning or other city's prohibit them completely.

Alderman Travaglini asked how far did the City get with the dumpster ordinance. Mayor Buckley stated that we could go back and look at that ordinance again.

Alderman Travaglini stated he liked the idea of issuing a permit to have a dumpster.

Mayor Buckley stated this would be very different from what the City has done before regarding dumpsters. She stated that if she was to make the decision, she would vote not to allow the cloth donation boxes in the City. She recommended to the Board to look at neighboring communities and see how they handle the donation boxes.

Alderman Travaglini asked do the cities that do not allow the clothing drop box legislation them out. Director Greever stated that there were example of other cities codes and ordinances in their packet that prohibit donation boxes passed by ordinance.

Alderman Scherer stated that you do see the more reputable charities like Goodwill. Mayor Buckley stated the city could not select which groups can be allowed or not. She stated that the city could keep the boxes to zones.

Alderman Kopff asked if the boxes could only be allowed for non for profit groups. Mayor Buckley stated that no, the city would have to allow all groups and their boxes

Director Greever stated that the City of St. Peters ordinance allows donation boxes only on the property of the organization that is benefits like on a church parking.

Alderman Kopff asked if the City has anything on the books to enforce the donations boxes. Director Greever stated no.

Mayor Buckley recommended that to the members to look around at other communities.

Mayor Buckley opened the discussion of the upcoming Fourth of July day parade. She stated they need someone to drive the pick-up truck. She stated that she will inquire about getting a bubble machine for the truck.

Alderman Travaglini asked if the City could get shirts with the city logo to wear for the parade, possible something with the American flag. Mayor Buckley stated she would look into getting t-shirts or polos for the parade.

Selection of Board of Aldermen President

Mayor Buckley stated that every year, following the Municipal Election, the Board was responsible for electing a Board President. Alderman Scherer made a motion to nominate Alderman Travaglini as Board President. Alderwoman Gorman seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

There being a majority of votes in favor, the Mayor declared that Alderman Mike Travaglini would be the new President of the Board of Aldermen.



Closed Session


