Roll Call

Mayor Buckley opened the meeting and City Clerk Llorián commenced with the roll call. The entire board was present.

Approval of Minutes

Mayor Buckley introduced the minutes for the June 14, 2016 work session and opened the floor for discussion. There being no discussion, Alderman Travaglini made a motion to approve the minutes. Alderman Scherer seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Ordinances

(Bill No. 2871)

Mayor Buckley introduced Bill No. 2871, a bill amending Title III: traffic code; of the City of Shrewsbury, Missouri code by deleting schedule XII-A: speed limits and replacing it with a new schedule XII-A: speed limits; providing for the current maintenance of this code; providing for the repeal of all conflicting ordinances; and providing for the effective date of this ordinance. Mayor Buckley asked if there was any discussion. There being no discussion, a motion was made by Alderman Scherer, seconded by Alderman Kauffmann, and it passed with a majority of the board voting in favor of the motion in accordance with Section 79.130 as approved by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, to read the Bill by Title only first time.

Discussion

Mayor Buckley open the discussion of clothing donation drop boxes. She stated that she drove around the City and noticed most of the dumpsters had clothes hanging out of the box. She stated that it is very difficult to monitor the dumpsters and that she received a call from a resident asking that the City make a motion to prohibit them.

Aldermen Kauffmann asked how many dumpsters are in the City. Mayor Buckley stated she counted six (6) clothing donation boxes.

Alderman Kopff stated he wondered if banning dumpsters would impact St. Vincent de Paul or St. Michael's.

Alderman Scherer stated St. Michael's has a small donation box near the rectory for food donation.

Mayor Buckley stated that a private dumpsters on private property would be easy to take care of. She stated that it is when a business is running a business on another business' property that there could be a zoning issue.

Superintendent Wagner stated that he received a called from a business requesting him to remove a donation box from their location that was not authorized to be placed there.

Director Greever stated that if the person's that placed the donation box there do not remove it that would be trespassing.

Alderman Travaglini asked if the mayor was suggesting banning dumpsters or clothing donation boxes. Mayor Buckley stated is would be clothing donation boxes. Alderman Travaglini suggested that the language be clear definition in the ordinance stating donation boxes.

Mayor Buckley recommend that the City should ban clothing donation boxes all together. Alderman Scherer and Alderman Travaglini suggest that there is clear definition to the type of donation box the city wishes to ban.

Mayor Buckley stated that Director Greever will draft up an ordinance for the Board to review.

Mayor Buckley open the discussion on the changes to Chapter 110 in the municipal code. She suggest the board to review the draft ordinance.

Old Business

Mayor Buckley stated they did not order t-shirts for the Fourth of July parade. She stated that she and Alderwoman Gorman will look at possibly decorating a float for the parade. She asked for a final count on those that will be participating in the parade.


New Business

Closed Session


