**Roll Call**

Mayor Buckley opened the meeting and City Clerk West commenced with the roll call. A quorum of the Board was present with Alderwoman Gorman being absent.

**Approval of Minutes**

Mayor Buckley introduced the minutes for the March 10, 2015 regular session and opened the floor for discussion. There being no discussion, Alderman Travaglini made a motion to approve the minutes. Alderman Scherer seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

**Hear Citizens**

**Plan Commission Appointment**

Mayor Buckley introduced the nomination of Randy Burkett to the Plan Commission, and noted that every ward except Ward 3 had 3 commissioners. She stated that Mr. Burkett had been considered for a while, but due to his role as lighting consultant to the Kenrick Plaza project, his appointment had been postponed until there was no conflict of interest. Alderman Travaglini made a motion to approve Randy Burkett's appointment to the Plan Commission. Alderman Steingrubby seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

### **Approval of Two New Police Officer Positions**

Mayor Buckley introduced the approval of two new police officers positions. She turned the discussion over to Police Chief Keller. Chief Keller stated that the City received a grant to pay for one of the City's officer to do some regional enforcement work. He stated that while this officer was participating in the grant position, the City would hire an additional officer to cover for this absence. In additions, the City would be hiring one additional officer in conjunction with the opening of Wal-Mart.

### **Ordinances**

#### **(Bill No. 2818)**

Mayor Buckley introduced Bill No. 2818, a bill authorizing the 2015 CDBG Supplemental Agreement, and asked if there was any discussion. There being no discussion, a motion was made by Alderman Scherer, seconded by Alderman Kopff, and unanimously passed in accordance with Section 79.130 as approved by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, to read the Bill by Title only for the first time. Mayor Buckley opened the floor for discussion. There being no discussion, a motion was made by Alderman Scherer, seconded by Alderman Kopff, and unanimously passed in accordance with Section 79.130 as approved by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, to read the Bill by Title only for the second time. Mayor Buckley opened the floor for final discussion. There being no discussion, Alderman Scherer made a motion that Bill No. 2818 be adopted to become Ordinance No. 2806. Alderman Steingrubby seconded the motion and upon roll call, the following vote was recorded: Alderman Kauffmann, "Aye"; Alderman Travaglini, "Aye"; Alderman Scherer, "Aye"; Alderman Kopff, "Aye"; and Alderman Steingrubby, "Aye".

There being a majority of votes in favor, the Mayor declared the motion passed and that Bill No. 2818 was adopted as Ordinance No. 2806.

#### **(Bill No. 2819)**

Mayor Buckley introduced Bill No. 2819, a bill authorizing and ratifying the Director of Administration's agreement with Standard and Poor's for the issuance of a rating, and asked if there was any discussion. There being no discussion, a motion was made by Alderman Steingrubby, seconded by Alderman Kopff, and unanimously passed in accordance with Section 79.130 as approved by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, to read the Bill by Title only for the first time. Mayor Buckley opened the floor for discussion. There being no discussion, a motion was made by Alderman Steingrubby, seconded by Alderman Kopff, and unanimously passed in accordance with Section 79.130 as approved by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, to read the Bill by Title only for the second time. Mayor Buckley opened the floor for final discussion. There being no discussion, Alderman Steingrubby made a motion that Bill No. 2819 be adopted to become Ordinance No. 2807. Alderman Kopff seconded the motion and upon roll call, the following vote was recorded: Alderman Kauffmann, "Aye"; Alderman Travaglini, "Aye"; Alderman Scherer, "Aye"; Alderman Kopff, "Aye"; and Alderman Steingrubby, "Aye".

There being a majority of votes in favor, the Mayor declared the motion passed and that Bill No. 2819 was adopted as Ordinance No. 2807.

### **Discussion**

Mayor Buckley introduced the discussion of Firearm Restrictions. Director Greever stated the City is looking at changes in the code book to the firearms restrictions to match the updated States statue. Mayor Buckley stated that the question may residents have asked is whether firearms be allowed in public building. Mayor Buckley stated that the updated changes would still prohibit firearms in public buildings.

Mayor Buckley introduced the discussion of the Webster Groves 4<sup>th</sup> of July Parade. She stated that the City has received the sign-up information and asked if anyone would be available to participate.

Mayor Buckley introduced the discussion of Trash Can Ordinance in a residential zone. Currently, the City doesn't have any restrictions on when trash cans be put out or brought back in. Alderman Travaglini offered to present his subdivision's guideline to trash cans to use as consideration in writing the ordinance. Director Greever stated that included in the packet where ordinances from surrounding municipality regarding time and placement of trash cans. Mayor Buckley stated that the City receives a lot of complaints that some trash cans are left out by the curve for long periods of time. Alderman Steingrubby suggested that the location of where the trash can may be stored be included in the ordinance.

Mayor Buckley introduced the discussion of Dumpster Ordinance in commercial zones. She suggested that in the ordinance, dumpsters visible from the street must be screened or fencing around it. She also mentioned clothing dumpsters for charities on business parking lots. There is no regulation to the clothing dumpster and she stated that people used these to dump all types of items that makes these containers an eyesore.

**Old & New Business**

Alderman Kopff stated that he had received a call from a resident who was concerned about the amount of stairs and hill climbing that the City's letter carriers had to do.

Mayor Buckley stated that the City got recertified for CALEA. She stated that Shrewsbury is one of the smallest cities in Missouri to receive the national accreditation.



Chief Keller stated that Police department would like to change the style of uniform the officers wear. The current style the police department use is becoming very limited to order.


**Closed Session**
