Roll Call

Mayor Buckley opened the meeting and City Clerk Carly West commenced with the roll call. A quorum of the Board was present.

Approval of Minutes

Mayor Buckley introduced the minutes of the August 12, 2014 Regular Session and opened the floor for discussion. There being no discussion, Alderman Travaglini made a motion to accept the minutes. Alderman Kauffmann seconded the motion, and it passed unanimously.

Hear Citizens

David Scalley of 7736 Arlington approached the Board to express his concern regarding how long trash cans were being left out at the curb. He also expressed some concerns about specific homes, but also thanked the City for the bulletins that were being sent out to keep the residents aware of things that were happening in the City.

Purchase Request

Police Chief Jeff Keller stated that funds had been allocated in the 2014 budget for radio charging racks which would be utilized along with the equipment from the County for the interoperable radio system. He stated that the charging racks could be purchased off the County contract for a total of \$3,442.50. Alderman Kauffmann made a motion to accept Chief Keller's recommendation. The motion was seconded by Alderman Scherer, and passed unanimously.

Ordinances

(Bill No. 2791)

Mayor Buckley introduced Bill No. 2791, a bill amending the City's Sunshine Law Policy, and asked if there was any discussion. There being no discussion, a motion was made by Alderman Steingrubby, seconded by Alderman Scherer, and unanimously passed in accordance with Section 79.130 as approved by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, to read the Bill by Title only for the first time. Mayor Buckley opened the floor for discussion. There being no discussion, a motion was made by Alderman Steingrubby, seconded by Alderman Scherer, and unanimously passed in accordance with Section 79.130 as approved by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, to read the Bill by Title only for the second time. Mayor Buckley opened the floor for final discussion. There being no discussion, Alderman Steingrubby made a motion that Bill No. 2791 be adopted to become Ordinance No. 2780. Alderman Scherer seconded the motion and upon roll call, the following vote was recorded: Alderman Kauffmann, "Aye"; Alderman Travaglini, "Aye"; Alderman Scherer, "Aye"; Alderman Kopff, "Aye"; and Alderman Steingrubby, "Aye".

There being a majority of votes in favor, the Mayor declared the motion passed and that Bill No. 2791 was adopted as Ordinance No. 2780.

(Bill No. 2792)

Mayor Buckley introduced Bill No. 2792, a bill approving a prisoner conveyance, and asked if there was any discussion. There being no discussion, a motion was made by Alderman Scherer, seconded by Alderman Kopff, and unanimously passed in accordance with Section 79.130 as approved by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, to read the Bill by Title only for the first time. Mayor Buckley opened the floor for discussion. There being no discussion, a motion was made by Alderman Kauffmann, seconded by Alderman Scherer, and unanimously passed in accordance with Section 79.130 as approved by the General Assembly of the State of Missouri, to read the Bill by Title only for the second time. Mayor Buckley opened the floor for final discussion. There being no discussion, Alderman Kauffmann made a motion that Bill No. 2792 be adopted to become Ordinance No. 2781. Alderman Scherer seconded the motion and upon roll call, the following vote was recorded: Alderman Kauffmann, "Aye"; Alderman Travaglini, "Aye"; Alderman Scherer, "Aye"; Alderman Kopff, "Aye"; and Alderman Steingrubby, "Aye".

There being a majority of votes in favor, the Mayor declared the motion passed and that Bill No. 2792 was adopted as Ordinance No. 2781.

Discussion

Mayor Buckley noted that the first item up for discussion, repeat nuisance violations, is something that would be discussed later, as more research needed to be done on the topic.

Director of Parks and Recreation Chris Buck gave an update on the SWT Park Grant. He presented proposed drawings of what the application would be asking for, which depicted stairs going from the City Center down to the ball fields, and a walking path that would go between the ball fields and connect with the existing walking path. He noted that he would be in contact with the community immediately behind the ball fields to make sure they were amenable to the changes. Mr. Buck also noted that there would be some beautification and landscaping being done to improve the parks, and explained the process for applying for the grant and what some of the qualifications were that would improve the City's chances of receiving the grant.

New Business

Mayor Buckley noted that Alderman Steingrubby had planted some native grass by the police station parking lot.


Old Business

Closed Session


